#### **Statistics**

- 27.3 million children and adolescents are poor, living in households with per capita income up to half the minimum wage finding themselves in very vulnerable situation.
- More than 250 thousand children and adolescents are sexually exploited in Brazil
- **90**% of children and adolescents are violated by people they know.

### **Negative effects of Sexual Violence**

Children that survive sexual exploitation usually suffer trauma which maybe physical, mental and emotional. The negative impact of trauma impacts the child in a variety of ways. It may lead to, physical risks include poor health, unwanted pregnancies for girls and a greater likelihood of HIV infection.

## **Negative effects of Sexual Violence**

Psychological trauma also contributes to problematic behaviour and trust issues. The majority of child survivors have substance abuse problems as they turn to drugs and alcohol in order to cope with their pain. Many will have suicidal thoughts and tendencies throughout the course of their lives because they feel unloved, ashamed and worthless.
