## OUTLINE OF ROMANS (Robert Deffinbaugh)

It is possible, believe it or not, to summarize the message of Romans with five words:

- Condemnation (chapters 1-3a),
- Justification (chapters 3b-5),
- Sanctification (chapters 6-8),
- Dispensation (chapters 9-11),
- Application (chapters 12-16).

- "Justification"

## 50 times in Romans!!!!

And their negatives 8 more times!

"Righteousness" or "righteous" can refer to...

- The attribute of God
- The activity of God
- The "judicial standing" that God grants to believers on the basis of their faith.

- I. The Universal Need of Justification (1st Cycle), 1:18-3:20.
  - A. Presented, 1:18-2:29.
    - 1. For the "heathen," 1:18-32.
    - 2. For the "moralist," 2:1-16.
    - 3. For the Jew, 2:17-29.
  - B. Hypophora, 3:1-20.

## HYPOPHORA:

Posing and answering potential questions that one's readers might have!

- II. The Only Means of Receiving Justification (2nd Cycle), 3:21-4:25.
  - A. Presented, 3:21-26.
  - B. Hypophora!, 3:27-4:25.

According to Romans 4:5, who does God justify?

- Ungodly Persons
- Who do no works
- But who believe in Jesus!

According to Romans 4:16, why is justification by faith?

- So that it could be by GRACE!
- SO THAT the promise will be guaranteed to all who believe!

Eternal Security was part of God's plan and intention from the very beginning!

WHAT does it mean to have faith?

Romans 4:21

Being fully assured that what God has promised He is able also to perform.

WHAT does a person have to believe about Jesus?

Romans 4:24-25

- Jesus our Lord was delivered over because of our transgressions.
- He was raised because of our justification!

- II. The Only Means of Receiving Justification (2nd Cycle), 3:21-4:25.
  - A. Presented, 3:21-26.
  - B. Hypophora, 3:27-4:25.

- III. The Benefits of Our Justification (3<sup>rd</sup> Cycle), 5:1-7:25.
  - A. Presented, 5:1-21.
  - B. Hypophora, 6:1-7:25.
    - 1. Shall we continue in sin? 6:1-14.
    - 2. Shall we sin, since we are not under law? 7:15-7:6.
    - 3. Is The Law sin? 7:7-12.
    - 4. Did that which is good become a cause of death for me? 7:13-25.

- IV. More Benefits of Our Justification (4th Cycle), 8:1-39.
  - A. Presented, 8:1-30.
  - B. Hypophora, 8:30-39.
    - 1. If God is for us, who is against us? 8:30-31.
    - 2. Who will bring a charge against God's elect? 8:33-34.
    - 3. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? 8:35-39.

- V. Application of these Justification Benefits to Israel (5th Cycle), 9:1-11:32.
  - A. Presented, 9:1-13.
  - B. Hypophora!, 9:14-11:32. Six Questions, posed and answered...9:14; 9:19; 9:30; 10:18; 11:1; 11:11.

Benediction, concluding the first "section" of Romans, 11:33-36.

Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and unfathomable His ways! For WHO HAS KNOWN THE MIND OF THE LORD, OR WHO BECAME HIS COUNSELOR? Or WHO HAS FIRST GIVEN TO HIM THAT IT MIGHT BE PAID BACK TO HIM AGAIN? For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever. Amen.

How do we know that Romans 12:1 begins a new "section" of the book?

Paul "abandons" the format of the "Cycles" that he used exclusively in chapters 1-11.

If Romans 5 and 8 are both discussing "Benefits" of our salvation, we should expect to see "similarities" between them.

What similarities do we see?

Romans 5	Similarity	Romans 8
1	Dramatic Contrast	1
16, 18	Prior condemnation	1
1	Peace	6
2, 4, 5	hope	20, 24, 25
2	Glory, glorified	18, 21, 30
5	Holy Spirit	4, 5, 6, 9, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 23, 26, 27

Romans 5	Similarity	Romans 8
5, 8	love (ἀγάπη)	28, 35, 37, 39
20 (ὑπερπερ ρισεύω )	"overcoming"	37 (ὑπερνικά ω)

SINCE Paul wrote Romans 1-11, using 5 cycles of "presentation"/"hypophora" to develop the theme of "Justification," Paul's structure should BE the structure that we would use to prepare an outline of that portion.
