

- Needless quarrels, 2:23
- Difficult times!, 3:1-8

The Power of Sola Scriptura...

- Power to work in spite of imprisonment, 2:8-9.
- Power to lead to wisdom, 3:15.
- Power to lead to salvation, 3:15.

The Profit of Sola Scriptura, 3:16...

- Teaching (Doctrine!).
 - Reproof.
- Correction.
- Training in righteousness.

The Purpose of Sola Scriptura, 3:17...

- Adequacy!
- Equipping for every good work.

The Prescription for Sola Scriptura...

- Retain the standard of sound words, 1:13!
- Guard the treasure entrusted to you, 1:14.
- Disciple others in it, 2:2.
- Handle it accurately, 2:15.
- Preach it!, 4:1-2.

The Rejection of Sola Scriptura, 4:3-4.

The Reaffirmation of Sola Scriptura, 4:5.
