WHAT SUFFERING DOES NOT (NECESSARILY) MEAN...

- You have sinned!
- God is angry with you!
- God does not love you!
- God has lost control of the world and cannot help you.

WHAT SUFFERING DOES NOT (NECESSARILY) MEAN...

- God does not care!
- You might as well give up!
- Your suffering will last forever!
- You just don't have enough faith to claim your deliverance!

Sources of Suffering...

- Satan!
- Natural consequences of living in a fallen, sin-cursed world
- Actions of other people
 - ✓ Persecution
 - ✓ Sins
 - ✓ Accidents/mistakes/negligence

Sources of Suffering...

- Our own actions...
 - ✓ Natural consequences of sin
 - ✓ Accidents/mistakes/negligence
 - ✓ Deliberate self-inflicted harm
- God
 - ✓ Chastening for sin
 - ✓ Discipline/Child-Training

- 1. God is sovereign...He is in control!
- 2. God is good and His will is good.
- 3. Any suffering we face in this life is allowed by God to accomplish a good purpose.

- 4. You may not ever know (in this life) the purpose God had for your suffering.
- 5. Suffering is a common part of life!
- 6. Suffering is especially a common part of a Christian's life.

- 7. Some suffering is necessary!
- 8. Any suffering we face in this life will be far less than we deserve.
- 9. Any suffering we face in this life will be far less than Jesus bore for us!

- 10. Any suffering we face in this life will not compare to the glory God will give us in heaven.
- 11. God will never allow you to be tempted (by the suffering) beyond what you are able.

12. God's grace is sufficient for you in whatever you may be suffering.
