Questions #2 and #3 deal with "Eternal Security"

- I John 5:11-13
 - ✓ You can know!!!
 - ✓ It's **eternal** life!!!

Question #1 asks the same question that the Philippian Jailor asked Paul in Acts 16:30, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

ANSWER:

"Believe on the Lord Jesus!"

(Acts 16:31)

 Consider the Clarity: Clear passages must interpret the unclear passages.

 Consider the Purpose: Passages that are written to specifically address a topic are to be preferred over passages that may contain a comment in passing about it.

 Consider the Genre: Passages in contexts that are written to teach should be preferred over passages of historical narrative or other genre.

 Consider the Dispensation: Passages written in or about the Dispensation of Grace (OUR Dispensation) should be preferred over passages from or about other Dispensations.

For the question of salvation/eternal life, look at...

- The Gospel of John (because of John's purpose: John 20:30-31)
- Romans 3:21-4:25 (because of Paul's purpose)
- Galatians (because of Paul's concern: Galatians 1:6-9)

According to Romans 4:5, Who does God justify???

Ungodly men...

Who do no work...

Who believe in Jesus!

People who add other conditions for salvation besides just "faith," end up confusing 2 different things:

They confuse the "once-for-all" act of justification, for the life-long process of sanctification!

People who add other conditions for salvation besides just "faith," end up confusing 2 different things:

They confuse the "results" of salvation, with the "basis" of salvation!

Before salvation: After salvation:

You can do NO good works.
Just believe in Jesus!

Do good works and grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus!

What about Acts 2:38, which says, "...'Repent...and be baptized... for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Romans 10:9-10, 13 "Issue": The words "saved" and "salvation" can be used in many other ways besides "spiritual salvation."

Romans 10:9-10, 13 In this difficult, theological, dispensational passage, where Paul is talking about God's plans for Israel, he uses the term "justify" or "justification" to refer to "spiritual salvation," because he is using "saved" and "salvation" in different ways!

Romans 10:13-15a

for "WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED." How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher? How will they preach unless they are sent?

Romans 10:15a-13...reverse, but actual chronological order:

- 1. Some are sent
- 2. Those who are sent, preach.
- 3. Because they preach, some hear
- 4. Some who hear, believe
- 5. Some who believe, call
- 6. Those who call are saved!

Two actions...by two "organs"... with two separate results!

ORGAN:	ACTION:	RESULT:
HEART	BELIEVES	RIGHTEOUS- NESS
MOUTH	CONFESSES	"SALVATION"

If a passage of Scripture seems to teach that salvation requires something other than faith in Jesus, then you can be sure that you have misunderstood that passage!

By grace alone!

Through faith alone!

In Jesus Christ alone!
