Jesus LORD?
- Believe, Confess and CALL?
- Believe, Confess, Call, and
make Jesus LORD?

Romans...

IN Cycle 2, Romans 3:21-4:25,
where Paul clearly
answers the question,
“What must I do to be saved,”
the answer is simple:
“just believe!”

How can we understand
Romans 10:9-10, 13,
in the light of
Romans 3:21-4:25??

It is a principle of Bible
interpretation that an unclear
passage must be interpreted
in the light of clear passages!

Cycle 5:

Paul is explaining that,
God currently, temporarily
setting aside Israel
does not violate the
“security” promises of Romans 8!

Cycle 5:

- The Word of God has not failed, 9:6.
- Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated, 9:13.
- He has mercy...and hardens, 9:16-24.
- Gentiles, 9:30ff

Cycle 5:

- God has not rejected His people, 11:1ff.
- Israel rejected... 11:15ff.
- Olive tree...natural and wild branches, 11:17-24.
- All Israel will be “saved,” 11:26.
- Gifts and callings of God are irrevocable, 11:28-32.

Cycle 5:

This heavily doctrinal,
dispensational,
theological passage
has to do with God's faithfulness
to His promises to Israel,
and the ultimate,
eschatological fulfillment
of those promises!

Cycle 5:

How does Romans 10
Verses 9-10 and 13
“fit” in that program?

How do they “fit”
in the *context* of
Romans 9-11?

Romans 10:13-15

Reversing the order to
make it chronological:

- Some are sent!
- Those who are sent, preach!
- Because they preach, some hear.
- Some who hear, believe in Him!
- Some who believe, call on Him.
- Those who call, are “saved.”

Romans 10:13-15

Reversing the order to
make it chronological:

- Some are sent!
- Those who are sent, preach!
- Because they preach, some hear.
- Some who hear, **believe in Him!**

- Some who believe, call on Him.
- Those who call, are “saved.”

Romans 10:13

is a quotation of Joel 2:32

Joel 2:32 is a promise of
PHYSICAL DELIVERANCE

for believing Jews,
during the Tribulation,
who call on the name of the Lord
for help.

**Which seems to be exactly
the way Paul is using it!**

This understanding of
“saved” in Romans 10:13
seems to agree perfectly
with the way “saved” is
used in Romans 9:27,
quoting Isaiah 10:22...

**Physical deliverance of
believing Jews (the remnant)
during the Tribulation!**

Well then, what about
Romans 10:9-10?

Beginning with “**For...**”,
verse 10 is explaining v. 9.

Romans 10:10

So the “**salvation**” that is being spoken of in Romans 10:9-10, 13 is NOT “spiritual salvation” (“justification”) but is rather, “physical deliverance,” and it applies specifically to Jews during the tribulation time.

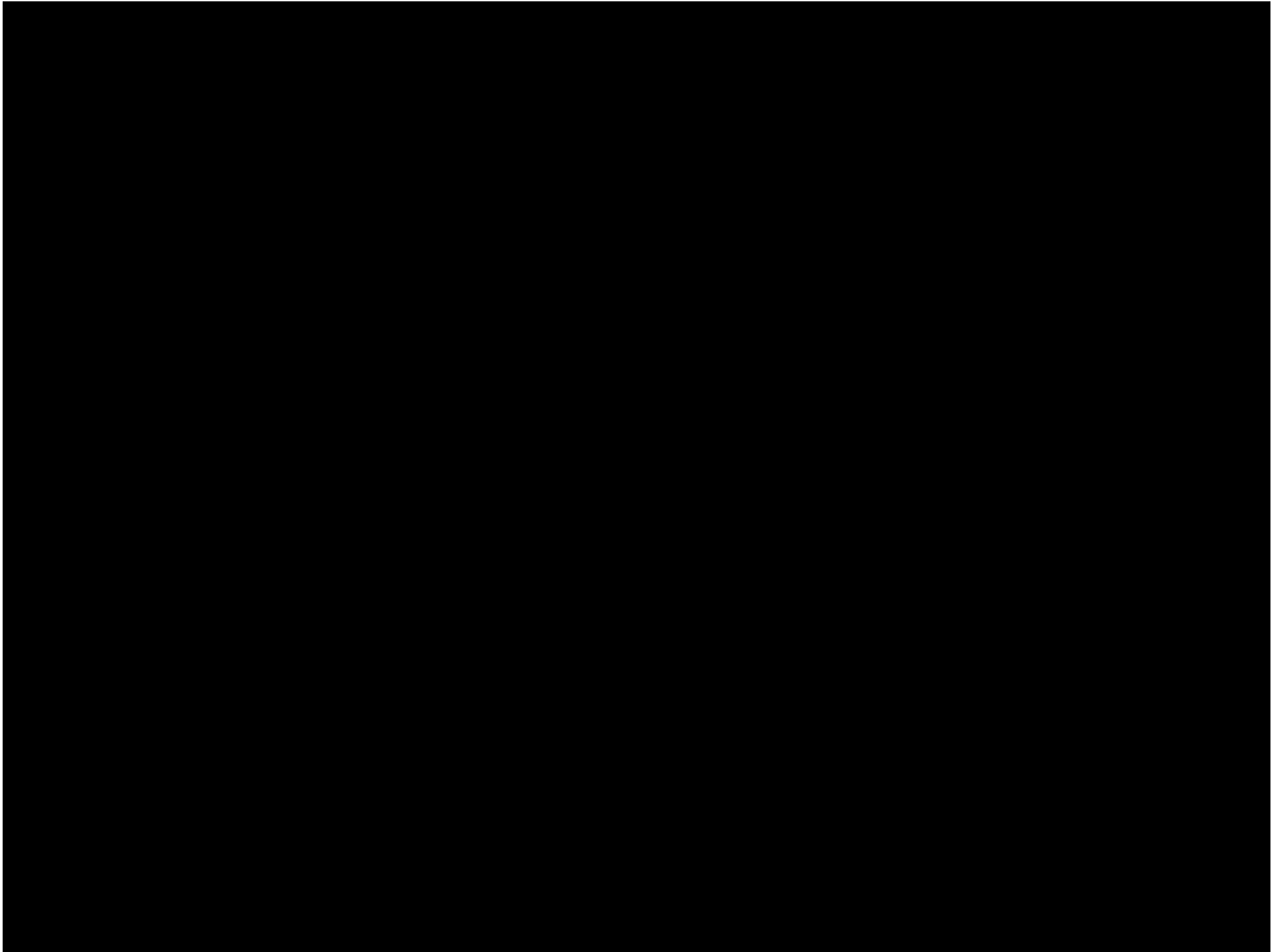

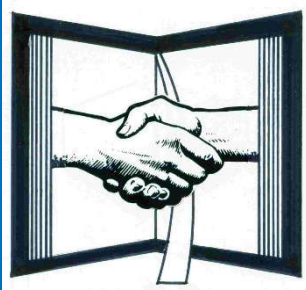
1. SO, does that mean that people can't get saved, if I used Romans 10:9, 10, 13??
