
The Book of Romans

Review:

- How did God create?
- Words have meaning and meaning originates in God
- God's word is the standard of meaning
- This destroys neutrality between DVP and HVP
- HVP takes a closed eyed approach
- Not creating a universal above God

Summary/Application

- Emotions will not transform you they will conform you.
- Rationalism will not transform you it will conform you.

Only the living and active Word of God can transform you.

- "For I say" (a reminder of Paul's authority and person)

Observation:

- "Spiritual gifts are a supernatural ability given to a believer at the time of salvation enabling him in a special way to minister to the body of Christ in the area of that gift." – Dave Kummer

- "For I say" (a reminder of Paul's authority and person)
- "through the grace given to me" (given the context I think this is speaking of his Spiritual gift as an Apostle)
- "to everyone who is among you" (this is an address to all believers... this needs to be stressed... it is NOT an elite group)

- "not to think too highly of oneself than what is necessary to think" -JPH
 - Don't think to highly
 - Than what is necessary (this subtly reinforces what Paul said about our identity in ch. 6-8)
- "rather to think in order to be sensible" JPH

- "not to think too highly of oneself than what is necessary to think" -JPH
- "rather to think in order to be sensible" JPH
- "as God has dealt out a measure of faith to each" -JPH
 - Faith in this context is related to the exercise of the gifts. So it is used in a sense related to Christian practice. I.e. our faith is to be used as we walk by faith.

Observation:

- "The faith in view in this verse, and in verse 6, seems to refer to one's ability to view and use his or her gifts as abilities that God has given."

- We are many members v. 4a
- We have differing functions v. 4b
- We are one in Christ v. 5a
- We are members of one another v. 5b

2. The Local Body's Unity vv. 4-5

Summary/Application:

- The individual believer grows according to vv. 1-2.
- The individual believer is uniquely gifted with a spiritual gift
- The gifts are intended for the corporate growth of the body
- Each individual is responsible to serve in their spiritual gift
- Each individual is responsible to serve other believers with their spiritual gift
- When this happens the local church will experience growth.

Observation:

- "Having then differing gifts"

- "according to the grace that is given to us"

Grace because these gifts lead to the edifying of the body but also the rewards of each individual believer.

- "let us use them" (not in the Greek)

- "whether prophecy, according to the proportion of the faith;"
- Prophecy is a noun rather than a verb participle like the rest. (Adjectival)
- There are two categories then that Paul lists for gifts in this text. This is the first one. (cf. 1 Peter 4:11)

- "Prophecy = Forth telling, and Foretelling. It is emphasizing specifically the receiving of direct revelation from God.
- This gift is no longer in function with the close of the canon. This is because God has revealed all that He intended to reveal. So, by way of secondary application, we can extrapolate here. If you are handling God's revelation, do so according to the proportion of the faith."

- "whether service, by serving,"
 - Service is a noun rather than listed a verb participle like the rest. (Adjectival)
 - This is the second category.

- "whether teachers, by the teaching,"
 - "teachers" is a verb participle and used in an adjectival sense. It is describing the person with the gift.
 - Teacher = διδάσκων (where we get the English word didactic.)
 - If you have this gift it is to be exercised in the teaching. (cf. James 3:1)

- "whether exhorters, by exhorting,"
 - "exhorters" is a verb participle and used in an adjectival sense.
 - Exhorters = $\pi \alpha \rho \alpha \kappa \alpha \lambda \tilde{\omega} v$
 - Compound word to call alongside.
 - The same root is used in verse 1 "I urge you"

- "whether exhorters, by exhorting,"
 - "This gift then seems to suggest the calling other believers to growth and pure living.
 - I think the other usage of this gift also includes the encouraging believers that are discouraged.
 - If you have this gift, it is to be exercised in your exhortation. (implied "by faith")

- "the givers, with generosity,"
 - "givers" is a verb participle and used in an adjectival sense.
 - Giver = to give or to share.
 - The qualifier is the giver is to give with generosity.
 - If you have this gift, it is to be exercised in excess. (implied "by faith")

- "the leaders, with diligence,"
 - "leaders" is a verb participle and used in an adjectival sense.
 - Leaders = one who leads or rules.
 - Compound word... lit. to stand in front or before.
 - The qualifier is the leader is to lead with diligence.
 - Diligence implies care, expedience, and humility.
 - If you have this gift, it is to be exercised and with the consideration that you will face THE Ruler.

- "the merciful ones, with cheerfulness."
 - "The merciful ones" = one who is compassionate.
 - The qualifier is the merciful one shows mercy with cheerfulness.
 - Cheerfulness = the general attitude of happiness of pleasure in showing mercy.
 - If you have this gift show mercy with cheerfulness because it is the exact approach Christ takes with sinners.

Summary/Application:

- Believers are gifted.
- Believers are responsible for using their gifts.
- Gifts are for the edification of all believers.
- Gifts are to be exercised in faith and dependence on God.
