- The solution to disunity v. 17
 - "Now I urge you, brothers"
 - "urge" = Παρακαλῶ (cf. 12:1)
 - "note those who cause divisions and offenses"
 - inote" = to be on the look out for
 - > "those who cause" (lit. note the divisive and tempters)
 - \triangleright "divisions" = διχοστασίας (cause dissensions cf. 1 Cor. 3)
 - ightharpoonup "offenses" = σκάνδαλα (those who bring about temptations)

- The solution to disunity v. 17
 - "contrary to the doctrine"
 - Doctrine = the content of teaching
 - "Which you learned"
 - > Learned when?
 - > Cf. Rom. 12-15 (Love & Liberty)
 - "and avoid them."
 - "avoid" imperative = turn away from them (aorist form used in Rom. 3:12)

- The cause of disunity v. 18
 - "for those who are such do not serve our Lord Jesus Christ"
 - "but their own belly" *NASB "appetite" (how?)
 - Cf. Rom. 14:13 ("cause to fall" is the same word used in v. 17)
 - "and by smooth words and flattering speech"
 - > "flattering speech" = words that are well chosen but untrue BDAG
 - "deceive the hearts of the simple."
 - "simple" *NASB and LSB "unsuspecting" I would prefer innocent... Paul's word play in v. 19

Summary/Application:

- The local church is to watch for divisive people and tempters.
- They are to be avoided.
- They do not serve Christ but deceive those who would.

- The testimony of the church at Rome v. 19a
 - "for your obedience has become known to all."
 - ➤ What obedience?
 - ➤ Who is all?

- The preservation of the testimony v. 19b
 - "Therefore I am glad on your behalf"
 - "but"
 - "I want you to be"
 - 1. "wise in what is good"
 - 2. "simple concerning evil" *NASB "innocent"

- The destruction of the enemy v. 20
 - "and the God of peace"
 - > Cf. Rom. 5:1
 - "will crush Satan under your feet shortly"
 - ➤ What? (cf. Gen. 3:15?)
 - ➤ When? (shortly can be used in two senses)
 - "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you amen."

Summary/Application:

- A testimony is intermittent not static.
- Maintenance of a good testimony requires wisdom towards good and innocence towards evil.
- THE enemy WILL be defeated.
- A good testimony requires grace (cf. Rom. 5:2)
