- 1) The nation dwelling in the land
 - > Cf. Deuteronomy 30:1-10
 - > Cf. Ezekiel 37:1-14

- 2) The Messiah incarnated
 - ➤ Matthew 1:18-25

- 3) The forerunner ministers
 - ➤ Matthew 3:1-12

- 4) The Messiah identified
 - Matthew 3:13-17 (Jn. 1:29-34)

- 5) The Messiah ministers
 - Matthew 4:12-12:50

- 6) The Day of the LORD
 - > Ezekiel 39:21-29
 - > Joel 2:28-29
 - > "in that day" (cf. Is. 2:10, 20; 3:7; 4:1)
 - > Isaiah 4:2-6
 - ➤ Isaiah 5:1-7

- 6) The Day of the LORD
 - John's three word pictures:
 - 1) Axe and the tree
 - > Emphasizes the judgment of the day of the LORD
 - 2) Baptism
 - > Emphasizes the division of the day of the LORD
 - 3) Winnowing
 - > Emphasizes the purification of the day of the LORD

2- Coming to be baptized vv. 13-15

Observations:

- Jesus comes to be baptized v. 13
- John protests v. 14
- Jesus responds v. 15
 - > "permit it to be so,"
 - > "for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."
- John agrees v. 15b

2- Coming to be baptized vv. 13-15

Summary/Application:

- Jesus needed to be baptized by John to fulfill the forerunner ministry and establish His identification as the Messiah.
- Are there times when we "out-righteous" God? (cf. Peter in Acts 10)

3- The Messiah identified vv. 16-17

Observations:

- Jesus is baptized v. 16a
- The three-fold witness v. 16b
 - 1) "Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him,"
 - ➤ Better "him" and referring to John (cf. Jn. 1:29-34)
 - 2) "and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him."
 - 3) "And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, 'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." v. 17

3- The Messiah identified vv. 16-17

Summary/Application:

- God told John how to identify the Messiah privately
- John baptizing Jesus identified the Messiah publicly
- The Son testified to His Messiahship by being baptized
- The Spirit testified by "alighting" LIKE a dove upon Jesus.
- The Father testified by saying: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
